BACKYARD HOLIDAY HABITATS FOR WILDLIFE

December is a great time to celebrate birds and other wildlife with a tree decorated just for them. Decorate an evergreen in your yard:

- **1.** Choose a tree or shrub to turn into a backyard holiday habitat for wildlife. Pick one that can be seen from a window for best wildlife viewing.
- **2.** String popcorn, cranberries and peanuts together to make pretty garlands around the tree.

- **3.** Make peanut butter and birdseed treats:
 - Collect pine cones and/or cut bread with cookie cutters.
 - Cover pine cones/bread slices with peanut butter.
 - Sprinkle birdseed on top.
 - Hang your ornaments.
- **4.** Slice apples and oranges into thin discs. Insert a string through individual slices and tie a loop. Hang them all over the tree as ornaments.
- **5.** Hang corncobs and sunflower heads from branch ends. They look like colorful lights!
- **6.** Add bundles of grass with seed heads for extra delights.

MOCKINGBIRD MUFFINS

1 cup commeal

1 cup flour

1 cup bread crumbs

½ teaspoon baking soda

³/₄ cup raisins

1/4 teaspoon sand

½ cup bacon drippings

1 cup water

Combine first six ingredients in a mixing bowl. Mix in bacon drippings and water. Spoon batter into lined muffin tins. **Bake at 350° F for 15 minutes.** Allow muffins to cool and attach to tree branches.
