 - The east side location is located on Eubank and I-40
 - People over 65 can get their pets spray/neuter/and vaccines for free.
 - They have out of state veterinarians organization on the weekends
 - There are currently 580 animals in the shelter.
 - They offer free microchips and pet tags.
 - You don't need to make an appointment, you can bring the animal to the shelter if the substation has no chip reader.
 - If you are surrendering a pet, those are by appointment only.

- Pet laws and city ordinances
 - Civil fines
 - 1st offense waived with conditions tied to services within animal welfare
 - 2nd offense a \$200 fine
 - 3rd offense a \$300 fine
 - 4th offense a \$500 fine
 - If you do get fined, you have time to pay it, if you are unable to pay it goes to collections.
 - Leash laws- The dog needs to be on a leash, there are exceptions for dog parks. However, in community parks the rules are different.

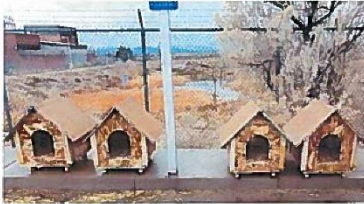

H.E.A.R.T Ordinance

As a pet owner, there are a few items in the Ordinance which you should be aware:

- All dogs and cats in the City of Albuquerque must be spayed or neutered, unless an Intact Permit is obtained (ICAP)
- A maximum of six Companion Animals; with a maximum of four dogs; are allowed in the City, unless a Multiple Companion Animal Permit is obtained
- All Companion Animal must have a current Rabies Vaccination and be Microchipped.
- If kept outside, Companion Animals must have shelter

Keeping Families Together

If you need help to keep your pet we offer:

- Free or low cost spay/neuter and vaccinations
- Free or low cost microchips
- Dog houses and straw
- Operation Keep Your Pet voucher
- Spay Your Mama Program



Found Pets

If you have found a pet, do the following:

- Check with neighbors to see if they recognize the pet (pets are usually found within a couple of miles of their home)
- Check for a microchip:
 - We have placed microchip scanners in Fire and Police Stations throughout Albuquerque; locations are listed on our website
 - Many Veterinary Clinics have scanners, as well as all of our Shelter locations
- If you are able to keep the pet, make a report through 311 and place flyers in the neighborhood where pet was found

Adoptions

The City of Albuquerque Animal Welfare Department offers pets for adoption at our Eastside and Westside Shelters and our Lucky Paws location. In addition, we have cats for adoption at Catopia Cat Cafe, PetSmart on Eubank and PetSmart on Renaissance. All of our adopted pets are:

- Spayed or neutered
- Vaccinated for their age
- Microchipped
- Free engraved ID tag for their collar
- For dogs-a free week of training through GoodPup



Clinic Services

Through our Preventative Pet Care Clinic we offer free or low cost vaccinations and spay neuter surgery

Please note: If you live in the City of Albuquerque, your pet is required to be spayed or neutered, unless you have obtained an Intact Companion Animal Permit (ICAP), be microchipped, and up to date on Rabies vaccines.
