1. Call to order – 6:30 PM

2. What is CPC?

- The CPC's unofficially started in 2012 and officially began in 2014. The purpose of the CPC is to have the ability to have police and neighborhoods increase communication.

3. Commander Jason Sanchez of the Compliance and Oversight Board

- APD has been in the settlement agreement since 2014
- There was a pattern of practice of unnecessary and excessive use of force. In 2014 a report from the DOJ initiated the 276 paragraphs that APD was responsible for.
- Each paragraph is measurable and has a component that dictates and governs how APD should operate.
- Written and crafted by the DOJ and signed by independent monitoring teams.
- Settlement agreement
 - There are different grades the monitor can give. There are primary compliance, secondary compliance, and operations compliance.
 - IMR 17 APD was fully operational compliance in all its paragraphs, and currently, they are 98% in compliance. The 2% that is not compliance is due to the CPOA from staffing and other concerns.
 - The draft report for IMR 21 is being released on March 15, 2025. The monitor sends out the draft reports every six months.
- Questions and discussions with community members.

4. Xochitl Campos-Biggs Chief Policy Advisor for APD

- Metro Crime initiative
- In this session they are working on several bills submitted by officers.
- Crisis intervention detectives attended the red flags laws.
 - Change to expand their opportunities to make the petition for a red flag order. To take a gun away from someone who has suicidal and homicidal ideologies.

- Change in auto theft penalties – when convicted of auto theft and then convicted of another auto theft differently they can put everything together as a felony and prosecute them.

5. NE Area Commander Ryan Nelson's Crime report

- In 2024 all crime categories of property and violent crimes decreased.
- Jan 2025 Stats (CADS)
 - Larceny of all types – 199
 - Residential burglary – 66
 - Commercial Burglary – 31
 - Auto theft – 82
 - Disturbance calls – 572
 - Family offenses – 260
 - Aggravated assaults and battery – 105
 - Robbery of all types – 11
 - CSP – 5
 - Calls for service for the of January – 7347
- Deterrence from certain parts of the city, APD is more present at stores and businesses.
