- 4. NW Area Command community updates Pete Gelabert, Crime Prevention Specialist, and crime update NW Area Commander Chris Patterson
 - This past Saturday they had the Annual Block Captain meeting at the APD Academy.
 - The Tuscany Neighborhood Association meeting is on October 22, 2024, at the NW Area Command Center
 - Petroglyphs Neighborhood Association Zoom meeting on October 29, 2024
 - Flyers will be sent out to community members about upcoming meetings
 - Coffee with a cop on October 31, 2024, at Krispy Kreme on 3709 Allison at 9 AM.
 - Staffing—There are 50 officers in the NW, 32 officers in the OJT process, and half a month left. Two lieutenant positions are open and will be filled by November.
 - APD has been working on a pilot program called Released Squad, which consists
 of officers and a sergeant from all over the city. They work from 4 pm to 2 am
 responding to calls that have been on hold for a long period of time. The squad is
 working on all calls for service throughout the city.
 - Aggravated assaults increased 5%, which are related to road rage incidents.

- Robberies are down 33% leading the city in the biggest reduction.
- Auto burglaries are down by 19%, and citizens are locking up valuables, and not leaving valuables in the vehicle.
- Burglaries are down 7% and shoplifting is up 33%. At the beginning of the year, they were at 77%.
- Auto theft is up 5% with 25 cars stolen.
- Traffic enforcement update
 - YTD over 5,000 citations issued, up 719 from the last report in August, that is 3.8 citations per stop.
 - They are focusing on Coors from Montanyo to Western trails. They issued about 1635 citations and had about 434 stops.
 - o Westside, had about 1,202 citations, and one arrest with the individual going 85 MPH in a 35MPH road.
 - o Ladera had 1019 citation
 - o McMahon and Montanyo issued 102 citations
 - o Golf Course and Universe, issued 230 citations.
 - o Holiday Tact plan is for the Coors and Cottonwood area.
