- 3. Xochitl Campos Biggs with an update on District 3 Legislative priorities with regards to law enforcement.**
 - Metro Crime initiative
 - In this session they are working on several bills submitted by officers.
 - Crisis intervention detectives attended the red flags laws.
 - Change to expand their opportunities to make the petition for a red flag order. To take a gun away from someone who has suicidal and homicidal ideologies.
 - Change in auto theft penalties – when convicted of auto theft and then convicted of another auto theft differently they can put everything together as a felony and prosecute them.
 - The 60-day session is about a 3rd away through, and bills are being introduced.

4. NW Area Commander Chris Patterson Crime update

- The bid will be starting soon.
 - The 2 Lieutenants are staying
 - 8 of the 10 sergeants are staying
 - About 80% of the officers stayed in the NW area command.
 - They have 51 officers
 - Currently twelve officers are on OJT.
 - There are five lateral officers
 - There are six conservation officers (open space officers)
- CRT Team (pilot project)
 - There are six officers, one Sgt. This team responds to calls that have been on hold for long periods. They went throughout the city responding to these calls. They work seven days a week from 4 pm to 2 am.
- Stats
 - Aggravated assaults down 9%
 - Robbery down 14%
 - Sex crimes up 20%
 - Auto theft down 5%
 - Burglary down 53%
 - Shoplifting down 81%
 - Auto burglary is down 33%
- APD is getting new police vehicles, and those will be equipped with license plate readers.
- There are license plate readers throughout the NW area command.
- Secure funding – APD got another helicopter that will be delivered in May or June.
- Crime prevention – Lock vehicle doors and don't leave guns in cars.
 - There were no guns stolen in the auto theft category.
 - Don't leave the garage door remote in care
- Traffic tact plan
 - 569 citations
 - 176 traffic stops
 - 400 stops a week with regular officers
