- 4. APD Chief Harold Medina
 - Settlement agreement Currently if everything goes the way it is going, on January 31st, there could be about five to seven paragraphs that could be dropped. These paragraphs are actively being monitored.
 - Crime Two major crime categories are in the plus: residential and commercial burglaries city-wide, auto theft is down, shoplifting is down, and auto burglary is down. Homicides and assaults are down from last August. By the end of the year, they should finish in homicides with a negative. Felony warrants are getting cleared. The homicide rate is at a 90% clearance rate.
 - Recruiting There is a possibility of 100 officers by next year.
 - Officer engagement Partnership with tribal communities around the state is going well. They assisted with a feast day in Jemez and Taos. The department continues to have monthly meetings with the tribal communities in the metro and statewide to share information.
 - Recent There have been three officers involved shooting within the last five months and did a media briefing.
 - Operations on central from San Pedro to Wyoming getting resources in that area and arresting individuals with felony warrants.

- Substation update The completion date is at the end of the month. There is going to be a recertification and officer appreciation at the substation possibly in February.
- The Triangle and university substation will remain open.

- Operations officers working hard on calls for service and attending their training.
- Auto theft warm-up throughout the city.
- The unhoused population needs help to stay out of the cold weather and into a shelter.
- Warrant round-ups are at 100%.
- Engagement Adopting a family to provide food for their Thanksgiving dinner.
- Aggravated assaults are the largest crime activity.
