 - DOJ – monitors report be successful
 - In compliance in the three levels:
 - Hoping for compliance of 100% on 1st level
 - Hoping for compliance of 100% on 2nd level
 - Hoping for compliance of 88% - 92% on 3rd level.
 - 22 paragraphs left that APD and CPOA are responsible.
 - No cases in backlog or missed. The average time on cases are 80 days, that is 40 days less than the CBA. They are meeting all deadlines.
 - Crime states- In 2017 there has been a 47% reduction in property crime. The reduction of call time has been about an hour.
 - four homicides less than last year.
 - Warrants
 - Felony warrants – 93
 - Felony arrest – 92
 - Recruiting – there are 30 in the academy and 30 for July.
 - New Recruits received a salary boost of \$17,000
 - Academy class of about 30
 - Community Policing – ambassador program
 - Events like coffee with a cop.
