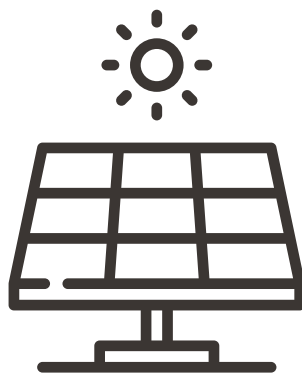
Building a Sustainable, Healthy Future for Albuquerque Families

What We've been Doing to Fostering Positive Growth in Albuquerque

Driving Toward Sustainability

- **Energy Efficiency:** Lighting upgrades in City facilities saved energy and reduced CO₂ emissions by 52 metric tons.
- **Fleet Transition:** Purchased 5 electric vans and 20 electric buses, advancing the transition to low- and zero-emission vehicles.
- **Tree Planting Initiative:** Planted 15,000 new trees, progressing toward our goal of 100,000 trees by 2030.

Innovative Mobility Solutions

- **Affordable Car-Share**

Program: Launched a new car-sharing platform, increasing equitable access to sustainable transportation.

- **Electric Vehicle Expansion:** Added infrastructure to support a growing fleet of electric vehicles.

Environmental Protection

- **Air Quality Monitoring:** Provides real-time data to residents and emergency health alerts via text when air quality becomes unsafe.
- **Food Safety Retail Ordinance:** Updated the ordinance to enhance compliance and

protect public health.

- **Urban Wildlife Team:** Promotes coexistence with wildlife and mitigates health risks through effective mosquito management

Waste Management & Climate Action

- **Biowaste Program:** Launched in April 2024, addressing human waste hazards with efficient cleanup services.
- **Methane Reduction:** Implemented food separation and composting programs to decrease landfill methane emissions.
