EMPOWERING BLACK ENTREPRENEURS

- Awarded "Corporation of the Year" by the Black Chamber of Commerce.
- Facilitated grants through the 3-tier Albuquerque Black Business Fund, supporting Black-owned businesses with essential resources and funding.

CULTURE CHANGE LEADERSHIP

• Facilitated 25 racial equity workshops and 15 language access workshops for city departments.

- Hosted the Mayor's Institute on City Design Bridging Boundaries

GUARANTEED BASIC INCOME: EXPLORING FINANCIAL STABILITY FOR ALL

Guaranteed Basic income is a program that provides individuals or families with a fixed amount of cash on a regular basis, with no strings attached. The goal is to create an economic safety net, empowering recipients to make decisions about their own needs—whether it's paying for rent, food, healthcare, education, or other essentials. Unlike traditional welfare programs, guaranteed income gives people the flexibility and dignity to choose how best to use the funds.

What We Did:

- Hosted a screening of "It's Basic" at the KiMo Theater, exploring the impact of guaranteed basic income.
- Facilitated a panel discussion with local leaders on its potential to reduce economic disparities, inspired by over 150 pilots across 27 states.

Why It Matters:

Guaranteed Basic income builds resilience, creates opportunities, and empowers families to make decisions that support their stability and future.
