This bike and walking loop— being completed in segments— will be our “Trail of Enchantment” connecting Downtown, Old Town, and the Rail Yards, and connecting the residents to the wellbeing benefits of the safe trail ways.

Downtown Crossing \$5 Million

Construction of infrastructure to allow the Rail Trail to cross Lomas Blvd.

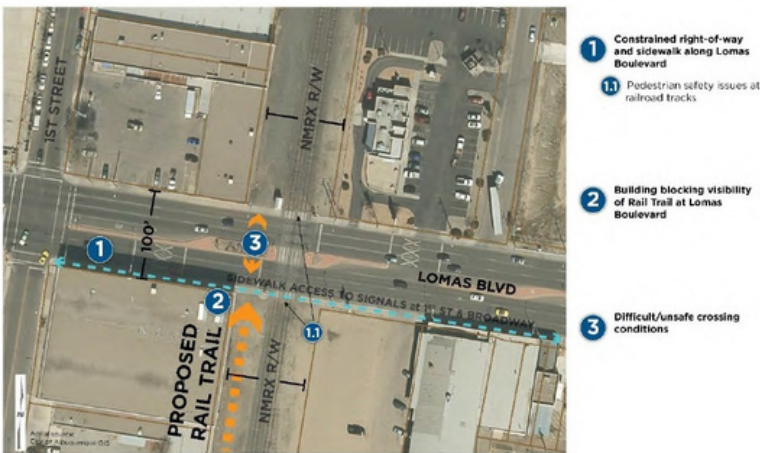


Figure 1: Diagram of Rail Trail Terminus at Lomas Boulevard

“Eco” and “Hispanic Heritage” Sections \$20 Million

This funding request will enable the City to acquire land and to plan, design, and construct sections to connect the Old Town to the community Bio Park, to Tingley Beach, and to National Hispanic Cultural Center, including pedestrian/bike/shuttle services.

Barelas Section \$5 Million

The Barelas segment of the Albuquerque Rail Trail will connect the historic Albuquerque Railyards to the popular Bosque bike trail via the National Hispanic Cultural Center.
