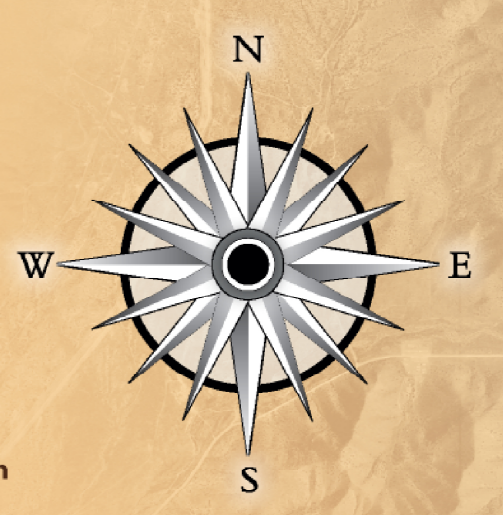


The Linework shown in this map has been overlaid over the existing 2011 COA Bikeways Map by Gannett Fleming West, Inc. for the City of Albuquerque



### Legend

- Multi-use Trail - A paved trail close to automotive traffic
- Bicycle Lane - A portion of the street with a designated lane for bicycles
- One-way Bicycle Lane - Similar to Bicycle Lane but only a single direction provided in the direction indicated by the arrows.
- Bicycle Route - Cars and bicycles share the street
- Bicycle Boulevard - A shared roadway optimized for bicycle traffic
- Mountain Bike Trail - An un-paved, but maintained trail for mountain bicycles
- Roads with Wide Shoulders
- Arroyos
- Bicycle/Pedestrian Overpass
- Mountain Bike Trailhead
- Place of Interest
- High School
- Bosque Trail Parking Locations
- Rapid Ride Stop
- Bicycle Shop
- New Mexico Rail Runner Express Station
