# SOUTHWEST POLICE BEATS



CRIME PREVENTION TIPS To protect your home from burglars, consider these effective measures:

- Eliminate Hiding Spots: Burglars prefer to operate unseen. Trim bushes and vegetation around your home, ensuring that windows and doors are visible.
- Install Security Cameras: Real or dummy security cameras can deter intruders. Secure Doors and Windows:
  Strong Locks: Reinforce door frames with sturdy strike plates and use deadbolts. Sliding Doors: Install a lock pin to prevent sliding doors from being forced open. Windows: Consider security film to reinforce glass against break-ins.
- Create an Illusion of Occupancy: Use timers for lights and electronics to simulate activity when you're away. Arrange for mail and packages to be collected or held to avoid piling up.
- Outdoor Lighting: Well-lit exteriors discourage burglars. Install motion-activated lights near entrances and pathways.
- Neighborhood Watch: Connect with neighbors and stay informed about local security concerns.
- Secure Garage and Shed: Lock garage doors and secure tools and ladders that could aid break-ins.

Remember, making your home less appealing to burglars reduces the risk of intrusion. Stay vigilant and take proactive steps to safeguard your property!

## SOUTHWEST AREA COMMAND CRIME STATISTICS

### **Definitions**

Burglary – Unauthorized entry of any vehicle, watercraft, aircraft, dwelling or other structure, moveable or immovable, with the intent to commit a felony or theft therein.

Robbery – Consists of the theft of anything of value from the person of another or from the immediate control of another, by use or threatened use of force or violence.

Motor Vehicle Theft – Consists of a person taking any vehicle or motor vehicle intentionally and without consent of the owner.



All attached crime numbers are preliminary numbers based on calls for service and pulled directly from the CADS system

## Substation Hours

All police substations are open to the public the hours of operation are from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM.

If you need an Accident Report form or a copy of an Accident Report you can call with your case number to have it mailed to you via US Mail they are not provided through email. When you come in to get a report make sure to bring in your ID and Case #. For any other report call the substation to make sure it is available before coming by (505)831-4705.

The Old Town Substation is now open Monday-Thursday 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM and on Friday 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM and on weekends from 11:00 PM to 7:00 PM.

**Message from Chief Medina** 

Happy Spring to everyone in our community, our department is gearing up for the summer months as it's a time of year we anticipate more crime, but we are diligently working on proactive operations to combat issues we see year to year.

In the last two months, the department's Traffic Division has been working proactive pedestrian safety operations specifically along the Central Avenue corridor as it's where we've seen growing concerns of fatal pedestrian crashes.

So far in 2024, we've investigated 10 fatal pedestrian crashes, and another eight crashes involving pedestrians resulted in serious injuries.

Traffic officers are educating the public but are also issuing citations for pedestrian violations and I hope the community keeps these concerns at front of mind as they are driving around the city.

We continue to focus on our shoplifting operations, we are seeing a decrease in these crimes in most areas of the city which goes to show our efforts on this issue are making an impact.





We just had a successful arrest of a known shoplifting offender by our Horse Mounted Unit as they were working patrols in the Southwest and successfully took the individual into custody after a short foot chase.

We now have a more realistic picture of shoplifting incidents in the city as we have strongly encouraged businesses to report

these crimes either through the Telephone Reporting Unit at (505)-242-COPS (2677), or online at https://www.cabq.gov/police/file-a-policereport-online.

We are also now working on operations focused on burglaries and we will be releasing more information on that in the near future.

Thank you for your support, as we continue to strive to make our community a safer place.
