A National

National Benchmark Surveys: The Blockwise National Benchmark Survey was conducted in March 2024 and reached thousands of residents from hundreds of communities across the United States. The survey content for each matches the same questionnaires we administer to our client communities. **The national scores are adjusted for your demographics** in order to give a sense of what the scores would look like if the whole country looked like your community. By making these adjustments, we minimize differences between the national score and your score.

Cohorts: To provide information to our clients on how residents in similar communities feel, we create a score at the "cohort" level. A cohort is a group of similar communities, based on demographics from the Census Bureau, including population density, age distribution, race/ethnicity distribution, gender, and median income. By using this approach rather than focusing just on size or geographic area, the cohorts are more relevant for each client.

Methodology

- **2,738 respondents** were recruited online between January 1 March 31, 2024, using targeted ads on various platforms (e.g., social media) as well as via online survey panels.
- Zencity's survey methods achieves representation at the city level by matching respondent data to the U.S. Census Bureau's race, ethnicity (Hispanic/Latino origin), age, and gender distributions in Albuquerque.
- Rake-weighting was applied as a statistical safeguard to balance out any remaining discrepancies in distribution so no demographic group is overrepresented or underrepresented in the final score.

Report Structure

- For each area command and the citywide level, the report provides an overview of the overall scores, **covering five key measures:** Safety, Fairness, Respect, Voice, and Transparency, **with a demographic breakdown** for each and **a presentation of the scores over time**. The measure scores are an average of between one and three questions. The questions included in each measure **are listed below**.
- For the citywide level, the report also **compares Albuquerque's scores** to the **national benchmark survey and a cohort of similar communities** based on demographics from the Census Bureau.
- The report then presents **the top concerns raised by respondents** in the following open-text question: What is the number one issue or problem in your local District that you would like the police to deal with?

Albuquerque Demographics

- The following racial and ethnic distribution is based on US Census data for the Albuquerque population over the age of 18. Due to the US Census questionnaire, there may be overlap between certain racial and ethnic groups (for example, one individual's responses may be included in the score calculation for both the "White" racial group and the "Hispanic" ethnic group.
- Racial Distribution:
 - White: 73%; American Indian or Alaska Native: 7.7%; Asian: 4.5% Black/African American: 4.4%
- Ethnic Distribution:
 - Hispanic Origin: 44%; Non-hispanic Origin: 56%

 - a. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement? In general, the police in my area treat everyone fairly regardless of who they are.

3. Respect:

- a. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement? In general, the police in my area would treat you with respect if you had contact with them for any reason.
- b. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement? In general, the police in my area treat local residents with respect.

4. Voice:

- a. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement? In general, the police in my area are approachable.
- b. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement? In general, the police in my area listen to and take into account the concerns of local residents.
- c. How willing would you be to contact the Albuquerque Police Department if you were a victim of a crime or were worried about something?

5. Transparency:

- a. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement? Albuquerque PD is an open and transparent organization.
- b. What could Albuquerque PD do to be more transparent with the community?
