MESSAGE FROM CHIEF MEDINA



Message from Chief Medina



Hello Albuquerque! I hope everyone is enjoying the cooler weather and gearing up for the holiday season.

I'd like to start off by sending a big thank you to all of our officers who have stepped up to the plate the last few months assisting with many events like the State Fair, Balloon Fiesta, protests and political rallies. There has been a lot going on in our community and it's the support from our officers that allow these events to run smoothly, and I truly appreciate each and every one of you.

I'd like to make the community aware of operations our department has conducted along the Central corridor in regards to open-air drug use and the trafficking of Fentanyl in the area. Over a two-day period, officers arrested 109 people who were using or selling Fentanyl.

In total, the operation resulted in the following:

- 147 on site generated calls
- 109 total arrests and warrants cleared
- 1 firearm recovered
- 10 traffic citations



We recently hosted a Domestic Violence Awareness seminar in honor of Domestic Violence Awareness month.

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS



NOVEMBER CRIME PREVENTION TIPS



- Never leave your vehicle running or with the keys inside the ignition... even if you're going inside for just a minute
- Keep valuables out of sight
- If you have an anti-theft device, use it!
- Park in a well lit area or as close to home as possible
- Buy a faraday pouch for your key fobs - they are designed to block electromagnetic signals, which eliminates the risk of relay theft



THANKSGIVING SAFETY TIPS



- **MAKE SURE YOUR SMOKE ALARMS ARE WORKING PROPERLY**
- **HAVE HOT PADS, MITTS, AND A FIRE EXTINGUISHER READY AS WELL AS MAKE SURE TO WEAR APPROPRIATE CLOTHING**
- **KEEP CHILDREN AWAY FROM THE STOVE. KIDS SHOULD BE AT LEAST 3 FEET AWAY**
- **KEEP MATCHES AND UTILITY LIGHTERS OUT OF REACH FROM CHILDREN**
- **DON'T DRINK AND DRIVE. DESIGNATE A DRIVER OR UTILIZE RIDESHARE SERVICES**
- **KEEP AN EYE ON THE WEATHER FOR WINTER WEATHER CONDITIONS. TAKE EXTRA TIME AND MAKE SURE YOUR CAR IS PREPARED**

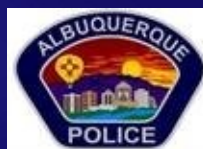
ABQ 311

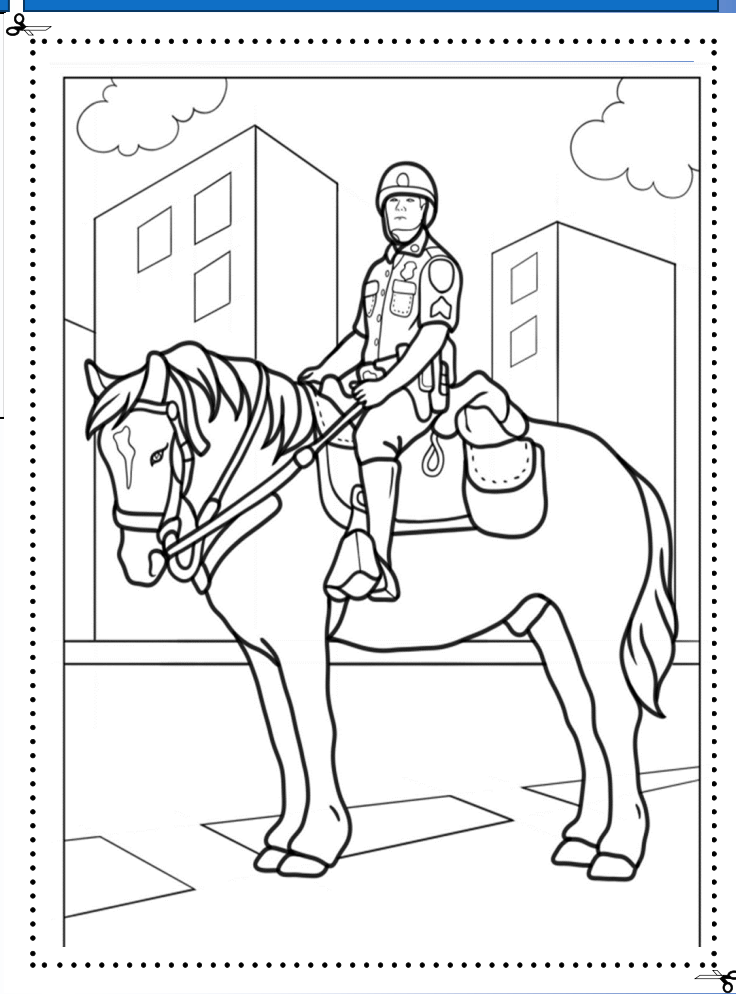
