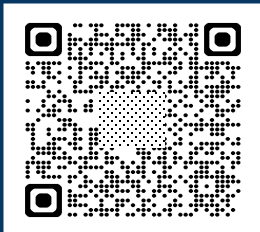

Warning Signs of Battering Behavior:

- Jealousy
Controlling Behavior
Isolation
Blaming Others
Verbal Abuse
Psychological Abuse
Cruelty to Children or Animals
Threats of Violence
Force During Arguments
Anger Easily When Drinking or Using Other Drugs
Breaking or Striking Objects
Discourage Other Friendships
Threaten with Weapon
Control Your Schedule
Accuses You of Being Unfaithful
Controls All Finances
Forces You to Have Sex

In an Emergency, Call 911

Call the police as soon as you can. Assault, even by a family member is a crime. Get medical attention, ask the medical staff to photograph your injuries and keep detailed record in the event action is necessary. Contact the court system about civil protection order. Leave the scene immediately.

**Crime Stoppers can now receive anonymous tips via text**

**ALBUQUERQUE** – The Albuquerque Metro Crime Stoppers is now offering a text option to report crime.

To expand its reach and provide more reporting options for the community, the Albuquerque Metro Crime Stoppers can receive tips via text. Neither phone number nor IP addresses will be traced or stored, and are filtered out to restore anonymity and privacy.

Anyone with information about a crime can text a tip to “ABQCS” to 738477.

Tips can also be reported by phone at (505)-843-STOP or online at [P3tips.com](http://P3tips.com).

The non-profit organization was created by an Albuquerque Police detective in 1976 with the assistance of local media and has been accepting anonymous tips ever since. Tips that lead to an arrest are eligible for a reward.

Crime Stoppers serves several agencies in the Albuquerque metro area to include the Albuquerque Police Department, the Bernalillo County Sheriff’s Office, Valencia County, Sandoval County, and Torrance County.

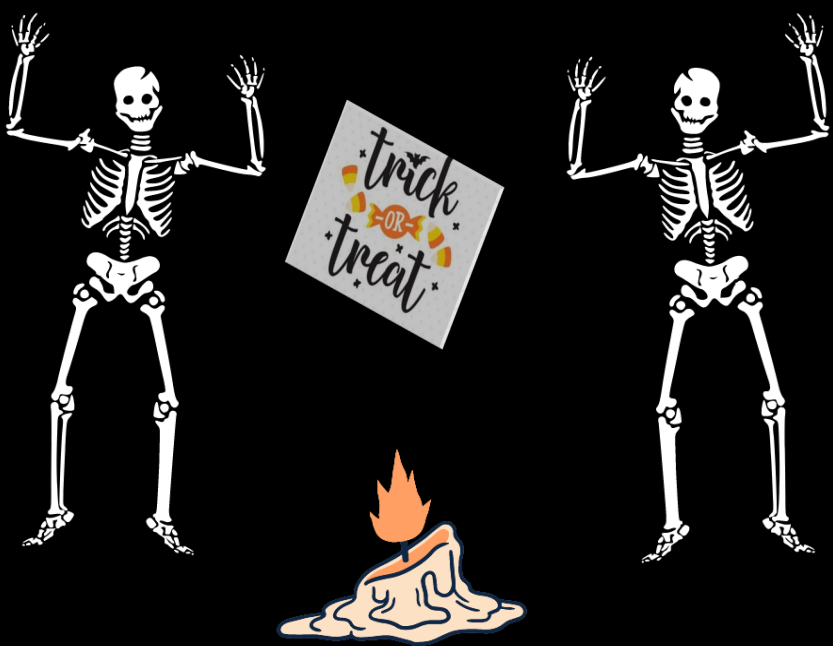

**Window to Opportunity: City Offering Grants to Help Local Businesses Affected by Vandalism**

ALBUQUERQUE – The City of Albuquerque is launching the Window to Opportunity grant to help businesses affected by vandalism. The program is a partnership between the Albuquerque Police Department (APD) and the Economic Development Department's Small Business Office. This new initiative will help alleviate the financial burden associated with replacing or repairing broken or vandalized windows for small businesses.

"We stand by our local businesses and are finding new ways to support them," said Mayor Tim Keller. "For a small business, the cost of vandalism can be devastating, and folks can get back to business sooner."

There is a total of \$200,000 available for the program. Eligible applicants include brick-and-mortar businesses with 25 or fewer employees, 501(c)(3) and 501(c)(6) non-profit organizations, and educational entities located within the City of Albuquerque boundaries.

The grant will reimburse up to 80% of the total cost of window replacement or repair, with a maximum reimbursement of \$5,000 per business. An additional \$1,000 is available for businesses that incorporate environmentally sustainable "green" glass or security glass into their repairs.

"By addressing window damage promptly, we can help ensure that our city remains a safe place for everyone, and a supportive place to do business" said Senior Economic Developer Frankie Hermosillo. "We are always looking for ways to adapt to the needs of our local business community and get them the help they need."

To qualify, incidents must have occurred on or after September 1, 2024, with appropriate documentation, including a police report and timestamped photos of the damaged and repaired windows. Applicants with an incident and window repair/replacement date from July 1, 2024 through August 31, 2024 are eligible to apply with a mandatory enrollment with the APD Business Crime Prevention Security Survey.

The Window to Opportunity Grant builds on the successful July 2020 Glass Replacement program, which provided similar support to Downtown properties. This new initiative extends that support to a broader range of businesses and organizations across Albuquerque.
