## How are we (the Foothills Area Command) doing with crime and crime prevention in October (1st through 11th)?

There have been 25 auto burglaries reports, 15 residential burglaries, 6 commercial burglaries, 20 stolen vehicles reported, 2 robberies to individuals, 1 robbery at a residence and 1 armed robbery at a business.

## **Residential Burglary Prevention Tips:**

Most of the residential burglaries are showing entries made at the back of the home via windows or sliding glass doors, and one via a doggie door that was unsecured. It's time to fortify your crime prevention plan for the back of the home by adding additional mechanisms that prevent lifting or sliding windows and sliding glass doors out of the tracks. Go to any big-box hardware store and check out the many types of devices on the market. There are also the options of security film on windows for breakage prevention and security screen doors with deadbolts, hinges that do not allow kicking in the door and deadbolts. Check your window screens – make sure they are property secured and not damaged and replace if it's time for a new screen. If you lack proper lighting, look into motion sensor lights for the back yard/patio and the entry points to your back yard (side gates, fences, etc.). Clean out the light covers – just swish with warm soapy water, rinse and dry – you'll bump up your lighting if the covers are clean. Check into cameras if that's your thing – most systems can now be monitored from a smart phone or tablet and APD has a camera registry to help get investigations rolling quickly in the event of a crime (www.cabq.gov/scan). If you have alarms, have you covered glass breakage or window movement to activate the alarm? Do you know your neighbors? They are extra eyes and ears on the block and if you share contact information, they can keep an eye on your home during work hours or if you are out of town and they can call 911 if they see any suspicious activity around your home. Start a Neighborhood Watch and get to know neighbors – your eyes and ears on the block.
