Commanders Corner:

Happy July University Area Command! Officers in the area command had a productive June with 25% reductions in Aggravated Assaults, a 10% reduction so far this year on top of a 50% reduction from 2023 in Robberies, and a 12% reduction in Auto Burglaries. However, we are still struggling with commercial and residential burglaries which are up 50% from 2023. Just last week we caught a serial burglary suspect who struck two homes in the University Area Command. A male individual broke into two occupied houses and stole items on two separate days during the last week of June. Luckily those houses and houses surrounding the victim's homes had amazing security camera footage of the offender. Burglary detectives were able to identify the male and capture him in the area of Zuni and San Mateo Se. The male was on probation from another burglary he was arrested for. The male's probation was revoked and warrants were issued for the two burglaries in the University Area Command.

On a brighter note we look forward to National Night Out on August 6, 2024. My staff and I will be out visiting neighborhood gatherings in the area command. If you or your neighborhood are not already signed up please contact Laura Kuehn at LKuehn@cabq.gov and sign up.

We even were able to bring back donations that were past the scope of donations for the collection site in Roswell and our crew in addition to eight of our pre-hires brought them to locations charities and shelters for individuals in need in our area.

Fireworks Safety



Fireworks are strictly prohibited in and around the Bosque or Open Space Area.

Prohibited Fireworks

City of Albuquerque Ordinance prohibits the sale and use of all Aerial Fireworks and Ground Audible Devices within the city limits.

- Using illegal fireworks is punishable with a citation and immediate confiscation of the illegal fireworks and places the community at risk for fires. Addresses that have been identified as using illegal fireworks will be issued a *CEASE AND DESIST ORDER* by mail.
- It is a misdemeanor
- A mandatory court appearance
- A fine up to \$500 and 90 days in jail
- The improper use of permissible fireworks and/or the illegal use of aerial or ground audible devices can result in the user or supervising adult being found grossly negligent and financially responsible for damages.

Permissible Fireworks

If you buy fireworks from retail stores and stands within city limits, the fireworks are legal. Read the Warning Label. If it reads "WARNING," it is illegal. If it reads "CAUTION," it is legal.

The following fireworks are safe and legal:

- Ground and hand held sparkling devices
- Cone Fountains
- Crackling Devices
- Cylindrical Fountains
- Flitter Sparklers
- Ground Spinners
- Illuminating Torches
- Wheels

Fireworks Patrol

Two weeks ahead of the 4th of July holiday, Albuquerque Fire Rescue will begin patrolling throughout the city and open space areas. These patrols help ensure the safety of our community by preventing the sales and use of illegal fireworks within city limits.
