

As the city continues to work to expand technology such as ShotSpotter, I am asking that you continue to report incidents of shots fired. The information you provide is instrumental in recovering evidence that may be crucial in catching drivers of crime. The holidays will be upon us in no time. Keep an eye on our most vulnerable and check in on your neighbors.



Message from Chief Medina



Hello Albuquerque! I hope everyone is enjoying the cooler weather and gearing up for the holiday season.

I'd like to start off by sending a big thank you to all of our officers who have stepped up to the plate the last few months assisting with many events like the State Fair, Balloon Fiesta, protests and political rallies. There has been a lot going on in our community and it's the support from our officers that allow these events to run smoothly, and I truly appreciate each and every one of you.

I'd like to make the community aware of operations our department has conduc-

ted along the Central corridor in regards to open-air drug use and the trafficking of Fentanyl in the area. Over a two-day period, officers arrested 109 people who were using or selling Fentanyl.

In total, the operation resulted in the following:

- 147 on site generated calls
- 109 total arrests and warrants cleared
- 1 firearm recovered
- 10 traffic citations





We recently hosted a Domestic Violence Awareness seminar in honor of Domestic Violence Awareness month.



NOVEMBER CRIME PREVENTION TIPS



- Never leave your vehicle running or with the keys inside the ignition... even if you're going inside for just a minute
- Keep valuables out of sight
- If you have an anti-theft device, use it!
- Park in a well lit area or as close to home as possible
- Buy a faraday pouch for your key fobs they are designed to block electromagnetic signals, which eliminates the risk of relay theft
