PRIORITIES OF SENIOR AFFAIRS

OPTIMIZING INTERNAL CAPACITY

Annual Client Survey

- Conducted annual client survey to gain a deeper understanding of services and develop insight into consumer satisfaction rates and the impact of services on consumers
- Survey Highlights:
 - 95% of clients reported being satisfied or highly satisfied with Senior and Multigenerational center facilities
 - 94% of clients reported being satisfied or highly satisfied with Home Delivered Meals
 - 94% of clients reported being satisfied or highly satisfied with Care Coordination referral services

Youth-Based Partnerships

- Hosted students from Amy Biehl Charter High School, Youth Development, Inc. (YDI), West Mesa High School, and the Mayor's Creative Youth Corps
- Provided resources and tools to develop work skills while interacting with older adults as part of an intergenerational community




Staffing Analysis

 Completed a departmentwide staffing analysis to prepare DSA to meet the growing demand of programs and services as indicated in DSA's Strategic Plan

Senior Community Service Employment Program

- The Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP) through Goodwill Industries of New Mexico provides low-income adults 55+ with work experience and training to assist them in securing permanent community-based employment
- During FY24, DSA hosted 10 participants from SCSEP

Center Memberships In FY24, DSA observed a 12% increase in center memberships over FY23. FY23 FY24 0 20,246



Volunteer Recruitment

- During FY24, AmeriCorps Seniors Retired & Senior Volunteer Program and Senior Companion Program both experienced significant gains, with SCP nearly doubling its number of active volunteers from 9 to 17
- DSA's all-ages Volunteers in Action (VIA) Program also grew significantly, increasing from 331 in FY23 to 449 volunteers in FY24



TECHNOLOGY & SAFETY

Transitioned to Paperless Files

- Streamlined operations by transitioning to paperless files for DSA Case Managers
- Over 4,000 case files were digitalized, securing the protected personal information of older adult clients, saving space, reducing costs, and increasing environmental sustainability



Safety Culture Award Winner

- Multiple DSA employees were honored with Safety Culture Award in May 2024
- Recognized by CABQ Risk Management for their outstanding commitment to ensuring a safe environment

Falls Prevention Awareness Week

- Partnered with NM Adult Falls Prevention Coalition to offer free falls risk screening event
- Provided over 200 older adults with free risk assessments, strength and balance tests, and safety education










Tax Preparation Services

- Partnered with AARP to provide free tax preparation services for seniors, reducing risk of taxrelated identity theft and crimes
- More than 4,600 state and federal tax returns prepared at DSA centers during 2024 tax season

Security Enhancements (Genetec/CCTV)

- Continued transition of all security systems to Genetec/CCTV system, integrating with APD's Real Time Crime Center to improve public safety and reduce occurrences of theft, criminal activity, and misconduct
- Enhanced safety features on DSA transportation shuttles including GPS tracking, emergency alert systems, and cameras with audio recording capabilities
- Additional security cameras installed at Manzano Mesa, North Domingo Baca, North Valley and Santa Barbara Martineztown facilities





ENHANCING QUALITY OF LIFE



Santa Barbara Martineztown Multigenerational Center Grand Opening

- Opened new 5,000 sq. ft. multigenerational center in historic Santa Barbara Martineztown neighborhood
- Available services include senior meals, out-of-school programs, and a wide variety of opportunities for fitness, recreation, and social enrichment


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Northwest Multigenerational Center Ground Breaking

- Began construction on a new multigenerational center in northwest Albuquerque near Cibola High School
- Will serve as an access point for City services and programs for residents of all ages including youth, seniors, and families

Firewood Partnership

- Home Services partnered with ABQ Fire Rescue to remove dead trees from Coronado Park to be used as firewood for local seniors in need
- 40 cords of wood collected, allowing DSA to assist around 400 older adults



New Mexico Golden Chile Award

- Received a 2023 NM Grown Golden Chile Award for supporting NM agriculture and serving locally grown food at senior meal sites and in home delivered meals
- NM Grown is a network of public institutions and community organizations that includes the NM Dept. of Health, NM Dept. of Public Education, and NM Aging & Long-Term Services Dept.

Home Delivered Meals In FY24, DSA observed a 19% increase in meals delivered to homebound older adults. FY23 FY24 200000 150000 157703



2024 Age-Friendly Summit

- Hosted inaugural Age Friendly Summit: Defying Ageism on September 26, 2023
- Created to empower the community to challenge ageist attitudes, foster community discussion, and serve as a catalyst for change
