TAB Chairperson's Report - Steve Pilon, Vice- Chair

Steve Pilon: There was a great turn out at the Adopt-A- Stop clean up on June 1. Thank you all for your help. Epoxy at ART Platforms look clean. Reminder there is not a TAB meeting in July.

Althea Atherton: Dara and I attended the PTAB meeting in May and it would be great to collaborate with PTAB and support each other's Boards. We learned clients will be able to make reservations 5 days in advance.

Christopher Love: I'd like to continue the communications between the Boards. It's a great opportunity to build a connection and work on projects together.

Dara Osher: I agree. I'd like to continue attending PTAB meetings and see how we can mutually support each other's groups.

Information Items

Andrew DeGarmo: I received questions from TAB regarding Network study. I organized these by topic. Web page is updated, Surveys are live; English and Spanish version. Span or service for Sunday, we can look at expanding hours. The proposed looks a lot better when comparing the frequencies. Route 50/16 is a difficult target market for span of service. We can look at other alternatives for the gap on Carlisle and Girard. We'd like to gather input and ideas. We can bring people to destinations but the destinations have to be interested in opening themselves to us. We have not got into route numbering. Regarding schools, we put the network together with our own knowledge of where the APS and bigger Charter schools. Please use interactive mapping tool for specific ideas of areas you may have. Microtransit zones areas in the SW could flow over to County and they would have to approve and fund that. We have not had a lot of communication with Kirtland. We reached out in the beginning of the project. They are definitely serious about increasing their security. Driver will not be able to drive on base. Route to base during pandemic ridership was falling and that is a very expensive route to run. Running smaller vehicles on lower ridership routes. We have thought about running a Sunvan, but it is not set up for a fixed Route service; no head sign, bike rack, no audible announcements. The cost is significant to get all these items on a smaller vehicle. We're still waiting on discussing bus stops until network is figured out.

Steve Pilon: Thank you to everyone who submitted questions to Andrew.

Director's Report: Leslie Keener, Transit Director

Leslie Keener: April ridership ART 195,693 riders increase of 11%; Fixed route 553,196 riders increase pf 1.3%; Sun Van 16.644 riders increase of 7.3%. We're continuing to see increases in ridership. Transit Budget was approved with 65.4 million budget. We'll start conversations with TAB in November to give an opportunity to have discussions on how budget season works. Recently made a change to pay for our drivers for a split shift differential pay about \$10/hour. We are entering an MOA with the State to allow our Training department to do CDL testing internally. We were 37% vacancy rate for MCO, netted 16 drivers since hiring rate. Vehicle mechanics have seen a little bit improvement on vacancies, at 41%. We hired a Mechanic II and 1 in process and also Mechanic III. Our next hiring event is July 26.

Mike Davis: ABQ Ride Connect, project goals include successful marketing of APP, 2.4-3 PPVH, and increase in ridership. Service is flexible, extended hours to 6:00pm and to Saturdays for June and July. Three months into service. Higher ridership in SW Mesa zone. We do allow Customer Feedback with great comments.

Ben Garland: Does van take people to bus route or just within the zone?

Mike Davis: Yes we made sure to include a major route in the zone and yes passengers can be take just within the zone

Steve Pilon: Is there any idea of how much it costs to drop people off? Is Mechanic II the highest level?

Mike Davis: Initial cost estimate is \$26 per trip.

Althea Atherton: How far in advance can you schedule Microtransit?

Mike Davis: Same day trips, one trip at a time.

Michael Devin: Any on time data for scheduled timed rides?

Mike Davis: Yes, we can see a graph with wait times and APP will also show how long your wait will be.

Christopher Ramirez: Is transit working with HHH to make sure we're doing our best to accommodate people to help get to the cooling centers?

Althea Atherton: Regarding Network Study: demographics on different routes. I want to make sure we are not leaving marginalized riders behind for specific routes for this study.

Andrew deGarmo: When we did on board surveys in 2022 our sample size was calculated to get a represented sample of the system, so high ridership routes we probably have enough data, but lower ridership routes we didn't get enough people to say what the demographics were.

Albert Lee: Does ABQ Ride have any plans to increase number of covered bus stops around the city for new proposed network.

Leslie Keener: No plans at this time.
