Community policing pilot project to be deployed in Northeast and Southwest area commands to assist with immediate response to property crime calls and complete investigations

PROPERTY CRIMES/PRIORITY III CALLS

Property crime, also known as priority III calls, typically do not require an immediate police

response. They are currently being performed by commissioned Police Officers. These calls are usually delayed reports of home burglaries, auto theft and other property crimes requiring a police report and investigation. Because the Community Response Specialist (CRS) will only respond to these Priority III calls, they will be able to devote a faster and more thorough response to the property crimes while allowing sworn officers to be proactive in solving and responding to other critical police incidents.

COMMUNITY RESPONSE SPECIALIST

Community Response Specialists' main functions are to timely respond to property crime calls requiring an investigation and detailed follow-up. CRS will be retired Police Officers with the skills and institutional knowledge to conduct a thorough investigation of property crime incidents.

CRS DIFFERENCES FROM APD:

- Only respond to auto theft, burglary and larceny
- Unarmed calls for service and do not have arrest authority
- Are former Police Officers certified and accredited with 20+ years of experience

CRS SIMILARITIES TO APD:


- Police Academy trained professionals
- Field Evidence and Crime Scene Investigation
- Will photograph, canvas neighborhoods and collect evidence and follow-up with victims
- Able to access pertinent law enforcement databases and coordinate investigations with APD detectives to solve and arrest offenders

CREDENTIALS:

- Retired Police Officers certified by LEA
- Level II Guard Card Certified
- Trained in crime scene investigation

CURRENT MODEL

843 officers respond to 499,614 calls/year 33% of 911 calls are mostly property crimes with no imminent danger nor existing immediate suspect



CRS ASSIST MODEL

CRS's will respond to property crime calls to alleviate 33,000 hours that APD commissioned officers spend filling out paperwork and tracking cases and criminals.










MDC POPULATION VS. AUTO THEFTS
